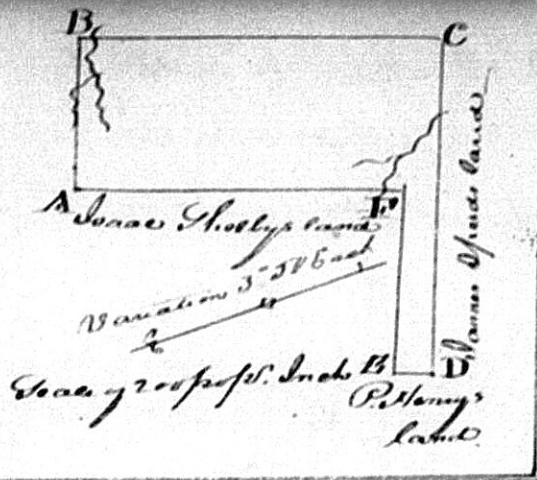

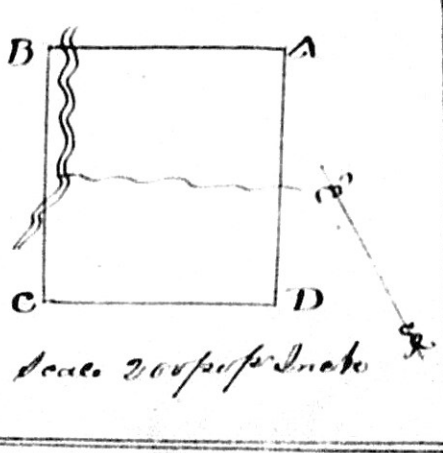
August 12th 1781  
 Survey'd for Evan Shelby five  
 Hundred Acres of land by virtue of a military  
 Warrant No. (33) Entered 23<sup>rd</sup> of April 1780 situated  
 lying and being in the County of Fayette adjoining  
 a survey of Isaac Shelby of 500 Acres on the west  
 South and South East sides and boundaries follow

(Acres) Beginning at A three white oaks corners Isaac Shelby thence  
 to 70 East 180 paces to B a cypress and white oak thence South 20 West 100 paces  
 crossing a branch to C three succowies thence to 70 West 100 paces to D cross-  
 ing five small branches to a honey locust marked 18 and two succowies  
 saplings in a line of Pritchards Henry thence with said Henry line to  
 20 East 36 paces to H an Elm Sugar tree and cypress corner to the said  
 Isaac thence with his line to 70 East 230 paces to I an Elm Sugar tree and cypress  
 now a branch thence to 30 East 36 1/2 paces to the Beginning

Fayette County March 15th 1781.  
 Surveyed for Joseph Bell Esq. of David T Bell  
 500 Acres of land by virtue of an Entry in part of a  
 military Warrant No. made June 5th 1780 lying  
 on Harrodsburgh Road and waters of Clear Creek -  
 Beginning at letter A a sugar tree corner of said  
 Bell Survey of 250 Acres and on a line of Pritchards

Survey thence with Pritchards line to 47 N. 258 paces crossing the Harrods-  
 burgh Road and a fork of Clear Creek to two succowies and a cypress tree  
 at B thence to 40 West 310 paces crossing said fork of Clear Creek to letter  
 C three white oaks thence to 47 S. 258 paces to letter D two small sugar trees  
 on the line of William McConnell Survey of 400 Acres thence to 40 E.  
 310 paces crossing a small branch of Clear Creek to the Beginning
