 ration of the ancient composition of Two pounds Sterling paid by Andrew  
Hairstone into the Treasury of the Commonwealth there is Granted by  
 the said Commonwealth unto the said Andrew Hairstone a certain tract  
 or parcel of land containing four hundred Acres by Survey bearing Date  
the Eighth day of November one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine  
 lying and being in the County of Bedford on West branches of the great  
 fork of falling River and bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning  
 at his own and weathers corner White Oak thence to a corner  
 thirty two poles to a Pine South thirty three degrees East thirty poles to

to a Red Oak South thirty six degrees bearing local branch to pines on  
 the Corner of the Hill South twenty six degrees West forty eight poles to  
 a Shrub white Oak South sixty degrees West twenty four poles to a  
 small Red Oak South twenty six degrees West twenty four poles to a pine  
 South Eighty degrees West one hundred poles to a pine North forty two  
 poles to the corner North sixty three degrees West two hundred and fifty six
