tion of the Ancient Comportion of Two hundred Sterling paid by Andrew
Hairston into the Treasury of the Commonwealth there is granted by
the said Commonwealth unto the said Andrew Hairston a certain tract
or parcel of Land containing four hundred Acres by Survey having Date
the eighth day of November one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine
lying and being in the County of Bedford on West branch of the South
fork of Falling River and bounded as follows to wit Beginning
at his own and neighbors corner White Oak known off South ten degrees West
forty two poles to a pine with thirty three degrees East thirty poles to

to a Red Oak South Sixty five Poles bearing back branch to plantation on
the Brow of the Hill South twenty five degrees West forty eight poles to
a Shrub white Oak South Sixty degrees West twenty four poles to a
small red oak South twenty five degrees West twenty five Poles to a pine
South Eighty degrees West one hundred poles to a pine North forty two
poles to plantation North Sixty three degrees West two hundred and fifty
poles to a black Jack near a bush South Seventy degrees West fifty
