This indenture made and entered into this the 13th day of March 1855 between Joseph Mhoon of the first part and George Hainston of the second part, Witnesseth that the said Mhoon for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty two hundred dollars to him paid by the said Hainston at and before the sealing & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged & by these presents doth bargain sell & convey to the said Hainston the North half of Section Thirty five in Township 17 Range 17 & three hundred and twenty acres more or less lands Subject to Sale at Columbus To have and to hold the said lands to the said Hainston his heirs &c forever - And the said Mhoon for himself his heirs & the right title to the said lands and the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Hainston his heirs &c will by these presents against himself his heirs &c and all persons whatever forever warrant and defend
