

Last Rites Tuesday For Mrs. Robert C. Patty

Funeral rites for Mrs. Robert C. Patty, who succumbed at the Columbus Hospital December 4 were held Tuesday afternoon, December 5, at 2:30 from the Mason Methodist church. The pastor, the Rev. J. Noel Hinson, officiated, assisted by the Rev. N. H. Gessler. Burial was made in the Odd Fellows cemetery with Dan's Funeral Home in charge.

The deceased, born Miss Rebecca Powell in Rolling Fork, Miss. October 30, 1881, was married to Robert C. Patty on August 3, 1900; moving soon after to Macon to make her home. She was preceded in death by Mr. Patty three years ago. A Methodist from birth she was true to the tenets of her faith, an asset to her community, and a kind and true friend to all who knew her.
