This Indenture made the twenty eighth day of January  
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty  
nine Between Fielding Lewis of the County of Frederick in the  
Commonwealth of Virginia of the one Part and George Noble and  
Thomas Fox both the said County in the said Commonwealth of  
the other Part Witnesses that the said Fielding for a  
provision for the payment of the Debts by him now owing and  
for and in Consideration of the sum of five shillings to him  
in hand paid by the said George and Thomas the receipt where-  
of he doth hereby acknowledge hath granted, bargained,  
sold, aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant  
bargain sell alien and confirm all that Tract or parcel of  
Land whereon the said Fielding now lives situate in the  
said County of Frederick and bounded as follow to wit.  
Beginning at a stone by the side of the road leading to  
Wattle town which is a corner to the land of Lawrence  
Lewis thence running with him North thirty six and one  
fourth degrees East two hundred and seventy five and one  
half

half Poles to two young black Oaks corner to Captain  
 Thomas Byrd thence with him north seventy six and  
 one half West two hundred and sixty eight Poles to his  
 Corner small Locust which is also a corner to the Land  
 of Robert Dunlap thence with him South fifteen and one  
 half West two hundred and thirty five Poles to his corner  
 young red Oak in the line of Colonel Hugh Nelson thence  
 with him South sixty eight East one hundred and seven-  
 ty seven Poles to the beginning containing three hundred  
 and forty four and one fourth Acres, which said Tract or  
 Parcel of Land is part of a larger Tract devised to the said  
 Fielding by the last Will and Testament of his deceased  
 Father Fielding Lewis esquire formerly of Fredericksburg in  
 the County of Spotsylvania and State aforesaid. And  
 all Houses, Edifices, Buildings, Orchards, Gardens,  
 Meadows, Pastures, Feedings, Woods, Underwoods, Ways  
 Paths, water, Water-courses, Easements, Profits, Commodi-  
 ties, Advantages, Emoluments, and Hereditaments what-  
 soever to the said Tract or Parcel of Land belonging or  
 in any wise appertaining AND also the Reversion  
 and Reversions Remainder & Remainders, Rents, Issues  
 and Profits of all and singular the said Premises and  
 of every part and parcel thereof With the appurtenances:  
 AND also all the Estate, right, Title, Interest, Claim  
 and Demand whatsoever of him the said Fielding of in &  
 to all and singular the said Premises, and of in and  
 to every part and parcel thereof with the appurte-  
 nances To Have and To Hold the said Tract or  
 parcel of Land and every part and parcel thereof with  
 the appurtenances unto the said George and Thomas  
 their Heirs and Assigns forever: Upon special Trust  
 and Confidence nevertheless and to the intent and  
 purpose that they the said George and Thomas shall

and will with all the convenient speed they can, sell and dispose of the said Tract or parcel of Land for the best price they can get for the same and out of the money arising thereby in the first place pay off and discharge all the Debts of the said Fielding which he now doth owe to any person or persons whatsoever provided the money arising from the sale of the said Tract or parcel of Land is sufficient to pay and satisfy the same with usual interest for all the said Debts respectively till the time of payment thereof: and in the next place reimburse and satisfy themselves all such Costs, Charges, and Expenses as they shall lay out expend or be put into in selling managing or disposing of the said Tract or parcel of Land

And upon the special Trust and Confidence also and to the intent and purpose that after all the said Debts shall be fully paid and Satisfied and the said George and Thomas reimbursed and satisfied all such charges and expenses as they shall lay out expend or be put unto in selling managing or disposing of the said Tract or parcel of Land that they the said George and Thomas their heirs, executors, and administrators shall pay all such overplus of money if any shall be as shall then remain in their hands in consequence of the said sale to the said Fielding Lewis his Executors or administrators.

And the said Fielding for himself and his heirs the said Tract or parcel of Land and every part and parcel thereof together with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining against him and his heirs and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever to the said George and Thomas their heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend by these Presents. In Witness whereof the said Fielding hath hereunto

set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year with-  
in written.
