March Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred
and ninety Between Fielding Lewis of the County
of Frederick and State of Virginia of the one part
and John Lewis of the County of Spotsylvania
and State of said of the other part. Witnesseth
that the said Fielding Lewis for and in Con:
:sideration of the sum of Twelve hundred pounds
current money of Virginia to him in hand paid
by the said John Lewis at and before the seal:
:ing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof
the said Fielding doth truly acknowledge. He
the said Fielding hath bargained and sold
and by these presents doth bargain and sell
unto the said John Lewis the whole of the follow:
:ing property (Viz^t) Negroes Abraham, Joe, Sall
and her children, Vix^t Romeo and Owen. Betty
and her children Vix^t Frederick Liddy, Ester, Warren
and Sam. Nan and her children Vix^t Milley, Simon,
Clarissa, Bess & Toby. also Daphny, Grace &
Jenny. as also two Waggons and the gear belong:
:ing to them. one small horse called Fox one
♂. called Ball, Fox about twelve years old cur
Ball about eight. one bay Horse called Slau:
ghter about twelve years old, one horse called Tit.
the bay about eleven years old one ♂. called
Bully


Bully black about thirteen years old, one
 Small Horse called Romulus about eight years
 old, one black horse called Ball, about fourteen
 years old, one small bay mare called Willis
 about seven years old with all the increase
 of the said Slaves and aforesaid Mare Together
 with one Chauatt and four hamp, belonging
 thereto five feather beds, ten blankets, five of
 sheets, six tattle cloths one walnut Desk
 of book case, Twenty large Silver Table Spoons
 fifteen Silver Tea Spoons, one pair Silver Tea
 Strongs Five black walnut bedsteads four
 Iron pots, one copper Kettle, two frying pans,
 three Iron pottrucks, one elmbe Still, two dozen
 Potater plates, one dozen Pewter dishes, twelve
 head of horned cattle, sixteen head of Sheep and
 thirty head of Hogs, with the Increase of the aforesaid
 cattle, Sheep & Hogs. To have and to hold
 the all aforesaid property goods and chattles above
 by these parents bargained and sold unto the said
 John Lewis his Heirs Executors Administrator and
 assigns from henceforth forever Provided always
 and upon Condition that if the said Fielding
 Lewis his Heirs Executors or Administrator do
 well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the
 said John Lewis his Executor, Administrator heirs
 or assigns at or upon the first day of January
 anno Domini one thousand eight hundred the
 sum of Twelve Hundred pounds Virginia Currency
 with Legal of annual Interest thereon from the date
 of these presents (without any deduction or abatement
 for Taxes or any other imposition upon the aforesaid
 property goods & Chattles) that then this present
 Indenture and every thing herein contained shall
 cease and be void. And the said Fielding Lewis
 for himself his heirs Executors or Administrator
 shall and will well and truly pay or cause to be
 paid unto the said John Lewis his heirs Executors
 Administrator

Administrators or Assigns the said sum of twelve hundred pounds at the Day and time and in manner and form aforesaid according to the true intent and meaning of these presents. And also that he the said John Lewis his heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns shall and may at all times after default shall be made in performance of the condition or proviso herein contained peaceably and quietly have hold occupy possess and enjoy the aforesaid property goods & Chattels and every of them with their Appurtenances to his and their own proper use & uses forever without the let trouble Hindrance or Disturbance or denial of him the said Fielding Lewis his heirs Executors Administrators or of any other person or persons whatsoever. And the said parties in witness thereof have hereunto affixed their hands and seals the day & Year first above written.
