In first place I give and bequeath milly a negro  
woman. My Family Carriage all & every particle of my  
Household <sup>furniture</sup> Kitchen, <sup>furniture</sup> and one third of my Estate  
both real and personal after my Just debts are paid to  
my wife Catharine D. Dado for and during her life

In the second place I give and bequeath a certain  
tract or parcel of land. Negroes Horses Stock furniture &c.  
that I have deeded and recorded in the Clerk's office  
in Noxubee County Miss. State to my two sons Robert F.  
Dado and Henry C. Dado joint in trust for the benefit  
of my Daughter Elizabeth. W. D. Dancy & her children as  
well as Childs part of all I possess.

In the third place I give & bequeath to my son Robert  
F. Dado a negro man named Jack which he is in posses-  
sion of priced at one thousand Dollars also one thousand  
One hundred & sixty three Dollars which I have charged in  
a title Book. Backed. my Childrens Book. in possession  
of my wife. which amt. so charged must be deducted  
from his share of my estate as so much Recd. in advan-  
ced. and also any other charges that I may have to  
advanced in like manner as above during my life

In the fourth place I give and bequeath to Ben  
A. Harrison of Noxubee Ct. Miss in trust for the  
Benefit of my son Henry C. Dado a negro man named  
Jewis. charged in my Childrens Book so one thousand  
Dollars. together with many some of money & property

which amt. must be deducted from his proportion of my estate as so much  
received in advance

In the Fifth place I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susanna F.  
Foster two Negro Girls by name Eliza & Sunny valued each at two  
Hundred Dollars charged in my children Book as so much  
advanced of her proportion of my estate which must be deducted  
from her proportion at a final division

In the Sixth place I give and bequeath to my son Geo. M.  
Dad William a yellow Bay Horse of better as a legacy independent  
of his <sup>full</sup> proportion of my estate at a final division

In the Seventh place I give and bequeath to my son H. H. Dad  
a negro boy named Carter son of Lucy as a legacy independent of his  
<sup>full</sup> proportion at a final division of my estate

In the eighth place it is my will and desire at my death that  
the property both real & personal to be divided as directed in the  
first Clause of this my will and two thirds to be divided equally  
between my children namely R. F. Dad, H. C. Dad, S. F. Foster  
L. M. Dad and J. H. Dad. Geo. M. Dad & Francis H. Dad  
having received no proportion they must first have an equal  
amt. each partitioned off to them that the three first named  
has received as charged in the body of this will and on my  
children Book my object is to place <sup>them</sup> on an equality at the first  
division at the death of my wife the remaining property to  
be equally divided between my four children named in the  
eighth article my daughter Elizabeth W. Dabney having been  
born & received a full child's proportion

In the ninth place in my will and desire that my daughter  
Elizabeth W. Dabney receive at the death of my wife  
two Hundred Dollars as legacy & I enjoin it on my executor  
her or after named to pay over to E. W. Dabney the amt.  
above named previous to a division at my wife's death

In the last place I appoint my wife Catharine  
D. Dad, Geo. M. Dad and H. M. Foster my son in law  
to carry this my last will & Testament into effect
