The last Will & Testament of David Moore was exhibited in Court and proved by the oath of the three subscribing witnesses &c. &c. recorded and on the motion of James Adams the Exor in said Will named, who made oath according to law and with Richard J. Mallow, Edward Frank and Lewis Hagood his Secy. int. into and acknowledged in the penalty of Ten thousand Dollars conditioned as the law directs, a Cert. is granted him for obtaining a probat of said Will in due form

It is ordered that Richard J. Mallow, Charles + Baywell, Abraham Debo, George Craft & Edward Sintercum or any three of them being first sworn for the purpose do truly and justly, to the best of their judgment, view and appraise all the personal and real estate of David Moore deceased ^{in this County} & then produce or shew and return such appraisement to the Court —

William M. Williams vs Jane G. Brightwell adm of Jason Brightwell decd. — upon a rule to give the Counter Security — The said Jane G. Brightwell having been heretofore summoned to appear to give the said Wm. M. Williams Security for the purpose of removing him as Secy. of the ^{said} adm. for her duty and faithful admin. of said Decedent's estate, and failing to do so, on Motion of the Plaintiff by his atty it is ordered that the estate of the said Jason Brightwell decd. administered by the said adm. be committed to the hands of Daniel Coleman Sheriff of this County to be administered according to law.
