 of all mercies first of all I commit my soul to God that gave it
 and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors
 in the faith and belief that at the general Resurrection my soul shall
 again be reunited to my body and received into the Communion
 and felicity of saints above, secondly I do make constitute and ordain
 this to be my last and testament as followeth Viz; That all my Just
 debts be paid, Item I give and bequeath unto my son Michael
 Wallace my large Bible to him and his heirs for ever, Item I
 Give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Boice the sum
 of Seventy Pounds to her and her heirs for ever, Item give and bequea
 unto my daughter Mary Henderson the sum of seventy Pounds
 to her and her heirs for ever, Item give and bequeath to my
 Hannah Wallace the sum of seventy Pounds to her and her heirs

for ever Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Susannah Collins the

 Samuel Wallace and my daughter Jean Wallace to them and their Heirs
 for ever, and if either of them die without lawfull Issue that the
 whole devind, to the surviving one, and it is also my will and desire that my
 Executors make sale of my Negro Girl Sal, with all the residue of my Estate
 whatsoever and the money arising from the same to be Equally divided
 betwixt my Son Michael Wallace, Elizabeth Price, Mary Henderson, Han-
 nah Wallace, Susannah Collins and Margaret Wallace, and lastly I do ap-
 -oint and Constitute my Son Michael Wallace, Thomas Collins and William
 Wood as Executors of this my last Will and Testament, Revoking and
 disannulling all other Wills and Testaments, whatsoever, Witness my hand and
 this Twentieth day of January one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty five

Wallace left in his will, to be divided between his daugh-
-hter Jane Wallace, and his son Samuel Wallace, allow-
-ing the S^r Jane, to have ^{= but on record called Betty} for his part Isack, and backey,
and allowing S^r Samuel Wallace to have for his part
Lucy Jacob and Sukey as witness our hands this tenth
day of May 1790
