Hainstone from Clement

This Indenture Made the Twenty eight day of July in the Year of our Lord one thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty nine Between Adam Clement and Agness his wife of the one part of the County of Bedford and Robert Hainstone of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Adam Clement and Agness his wife for and in consideration of one Hundred Pound Lawfull Money of Virginia to him in hand payed the Receipt where of he doth hereby acknowledge hath granted Bargained Sole Released and confirmed and by these Presents doth grant Bargain sell Release and confirm unto Robert Hainstone and to his heirs and assigns forever Certain Tract of Land containing two Hundred acres Lying and being in the County of Pittsylvania at the fork of Runnet bag Creek a north branch of Invin River and bounded as Followeth To Wit Beginning at a hermit and running thence north lines North Twenty Degree East Crossing a Branch one Hundred and forty Poles to a dogwood South Sixty five degrees West Crossing Otter Creek one of the Forks of the said Runnet Bag and four Branches four Hundred and four Poles to a locust on the north side of

Runnet Bag Creek thence down the said Creek as it Meanders Thirtiety four Poles to the cory on the south side thence off South Fifteen Degree East Sixty Poles to a white Oak by a Branch East forty two Poles to a poplar by a Branch north Twenty five degrees East and Hundred & two Poles to a cory North Eighty Degree East Eighty eight Poles to a white Oak South thirty five degrees East one hundred & fifty Poles to a cory on the south side of the Creek below the fork and thence crossing the Creek north Eighty Poles to the first Station with all woods Swamps meadows and all other Profits and Commodities to the same Belonging and all the Estate Title Interest Claim and Demand what so ever of him the said Adam Clement and Agness his wife in and to the said Land and Premises and every part thereof to have and to hold the said Tract of Land and all other the before granted Premises with their Appertinances unto the said Robert Hainstone and to his heirs & assigns forever the only Proper use and behooff of him the said Robert Hainstone his heirs and assigns forever and the said Adam Clement and Agness his wife for them and their heirs the said Land and Premises against them and their heirs and all other persons claiming from by or under them or any of them to the said Robert Hainstone shall and will Warrant and forever defend by these Presents In Witness where of the Adam Clement & Agness his wife hath hereunto set their hands and Seals the day and year above written
