Know all men by these Presents That we Robert Hairiston W<sup>m</sup>  
Tunstall John Salmon Henry Syne & George Hairiston of the County  
of Henry are held and firmly bound unto Abraham Penn Peter Saunders  
Jesse Beard & John Fontaine Esq<sup>s</sup> Justices of the Peace for the said  
County their Heirs & Successors in the sum of Five Hundred Pounds  
To which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves and  
each of us our and each of our Heirs Exors. & Adm<sup>s</sup> jointly & severally  
firmly by these Presents sealed with our seals & Dated this 25<sup>th</sup>  
Day of January 1782

The Condition of the above Obligation is such That Whereas the  
above bound Robert Hairiston is constituted, and, appointed Sheriff of the  
County aforesaid, by his Excellency the Governor & Therefore the said  
Robert Hairiston shall <sup>well</sup> and truly collect all Officers Fees & Dues put  
into his hands to collect and truly account for and pay the same to the  
Officers to whom such Fees are due Respectively at such Times as we  
prescribed by Law and Limited, and shall well and truly execute  
and due return make of all Process and Procepts to him Directed,  
and pay and satisfy all sums of Money and Tobacco by him collected  
by Virtue of any Procept to the Person or Persons to whom the same  
are due his or their Exors Adm<sup>s</sup> or Assigns and in all other things  
shall truly and Faithfully Perform the s<sup>d</sup> Office of Sheriff During  
the Time of his Continuance therein Then the above Obligation to  
be Void, and of none Effect, otherwise to Remain in full force  
Power & Virtue
