

This Indenture made the Twenty second day of October One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty One Between Charles Caffery Junior of the County of Bedford of the One part and Samuel Hairston of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Charles Caffery for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds Current money of Virginia to him in hand paid the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath Granted Bargained sold and Released and Confirmed and by these presents doth Grant Bargain Sell Release and Confirm unto the said Samuel Hairston and to his Heirs and assigns forever One certain Tract of Lands Two Hundred acres be the same more or Less lying and being in the County of Bedford on the East branches of Beaver Creek on both sides of the main Road and Bounded as followeth to wit Begining at Samuel Hairstons Corner small white Oak thence along his line south fifty Two Degrees

 Between Elizabeth Littlepage and Battan
 Daubins both of Campbell County who entermar-
 ried with my Daughter Frances and for the
 respect I have to my said Daughter. I give
 to my son in law Battin Daubins a negroe
 Girl named Sale with all her Increase Except
 her first Born. in Case there should not be a
 negroe a Piece. at my death for my Children that
 I now have but if the said Elizabeth Littlepage
 should at her death have a negroe a piece for her
 Children. then the said negroe Child shall
 remain the said Daubins to him and his
 Heirs forever. as Witness my hand and seal
 this sixth day of February. 1782.
