Claiborne of the County of Sussex of the other part Witnesseth that the said John DePriest and Sarah his wife for and in consideration of three hundred and thirty pounds current money of Virginia to them in hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said William P. Claiborne and his heirs a certain tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Campbell and bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning at point corner to the said DePriest then N 35 W 352 poles to a Pine corner to David Ross then N 45 E 48 poles to a white oak corner to the said Ross then S 56 E 31 1/2 poles to a gum in a branch corner to Samuel Fleming then S 32 W 100 poles to a red oak corner to said Fleming and DePriest and then S 56 W 92 poles to the first station containing by survey two hundred seventy four and three quarters of an acre be the same more or less To have and to hold the said bargained premises with all its rents profits issues and appurtenances to him the said William P. Claiborne his heirs and assigns forever and the said John DePriest doth by these presents covenant and agree to warrant for himself and heirs the aforesaid bargained premises to him the said William P. This Indenture made this 7<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four between Robert Alexander Executor of the last will and testament of Samuel Hairston deceased of the County of Campbell and State of Virginia of the one part and John Alexander of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesses that the said Robert Alexander Ex. of Samuel Hairston decd. as aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and sixty Dollars current money of Virginia To him in hand paid the receipt of which he doth hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said John Alexander his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid on the East branches of Beaver creek and on both sides of



146 the main road leading from New London to Richmond containing two hundred acres by survey bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> day of November 1777 and patented in the name of Samuel Hairston which patent was granted by Thomas Jefferson Governor of the State of Virginia the first day of September 1780 and bounded as followeth Vly. Beginning at Samuel Hairstons corner small whiteoak now Sackville Kings corner thence along his line South fifty two degrees East crossing the road and hunch two hundred poles to his corner pointers on a spur of the long mountain thence off across the spurs and valleys thereof to the second corner pine North forty degrees East one hundred and eighty poles to a pine North ten degrees East sixteen poles to a pine North thirty degrees West forty poles to a pine North forty four degrees West fifty poles crossing the main road to a pine North sixty three degrees West ten poles to two landmarks South eighty five degrees West fifty poles to pointers North sixteen degrees West thirty four poles to a pine South Seventy three degrees West sixty four poles to a shrub whiteoak South forty degrees West fifty four poles to pointers South thirty degrees West seventy four poles to a pine and South fifty seven degrees West twenty eight poles to the first station with the appurtenances To have and to hold the aforementioned tract of land and premises to the said John Alexander his heirs and assigns forever and he the said Robert Alexander <sup>or as aforesaid</sup> for himself and his heirs agree to warrant and forever defend the said lands and premises aforesaid from the Claim or Claims of all and every person or persons whatever claiming the same from by or under him the said Robert Alexander <sup>or</sup> as aforesaid and his heirs but against the claim or claims of no other person or persons.
