

A Court held for Campbell County August 7<sup>th</sup> 1783.

Ordered that the following claims be certified Viz.

- ✓ James Martins for 64<sup>n</sup> Lt Bacon furnished the Bedford Militia on their march to the Southward.
- ✓ Rebecca Balls for one Smooth Bore Gun Impreg'd for the use of the Bedford Militia on their march to join Gen Green for which she is allowed by the Court £ 7<sup>n</sup> 10. 0
- ✓ Richard Wammakers for one Rifle Gun Impreg'd for the use of the Bedford Militia on their march to join Gen Green for which he is allowed by the Court £ 6<sup>n</sup> 5. 0
- ✓ John Ward Gent. for <sup>one hundred</sup> Eighty three Gallons of Peach Brandy of the best Quality proved by Sundry Depositions to have been delivered Gen Green's Army while at Deep River in Chatham County and State of N<sup>c</sup> Carolina also four Bushels of Corn and one Quart Brandy furnished them & Publick in November 1782.

September Court 1783.

- ✓ William Brown (Vineyard) for Boarding two British Prisoners (Viz) William McDougall and Laughlin Cameron 12 months each by Order of Gen Green.
- ✓ John Ward Gent. for 57 Days Pasturage for 40 head of Publick Bees furnished after Quire corn Pro. Linc

November Court 1785.

- ✓ William Brown for thirty five days service of his Waggon Team & Man in Remov'g Military Stores from Virginia to N<sup>c</sup> Carolina and furnishing them with one Barrel of Corn.
- ✓ Robert Alexander Son of Samuel Hairstyhead for the following Certificates (Viz) P. Shibley for 3<sup>d</sup> Gallons Corn & 8 Bundles fodder - Andrew Henry for 2 Barrels Corn - 203 Bundles fodder and a Quarter of Fodder Valued at £ 30. 10. 0 in November 1780
- ✓ John Porters for the Pasturage of 62 head of Cattle
- ✓ 8 Diets Pasturage for 8 Horses & 11 Diets of John Hill
- ✓ for 10 Bundles fodder 6 Quarts Corn Stallsage for one Horse 3 Diets & Lodging - Joseph Ponder for 8 Diets
- ✓ Thomas Whalin for putting on 2 Horse shoes
