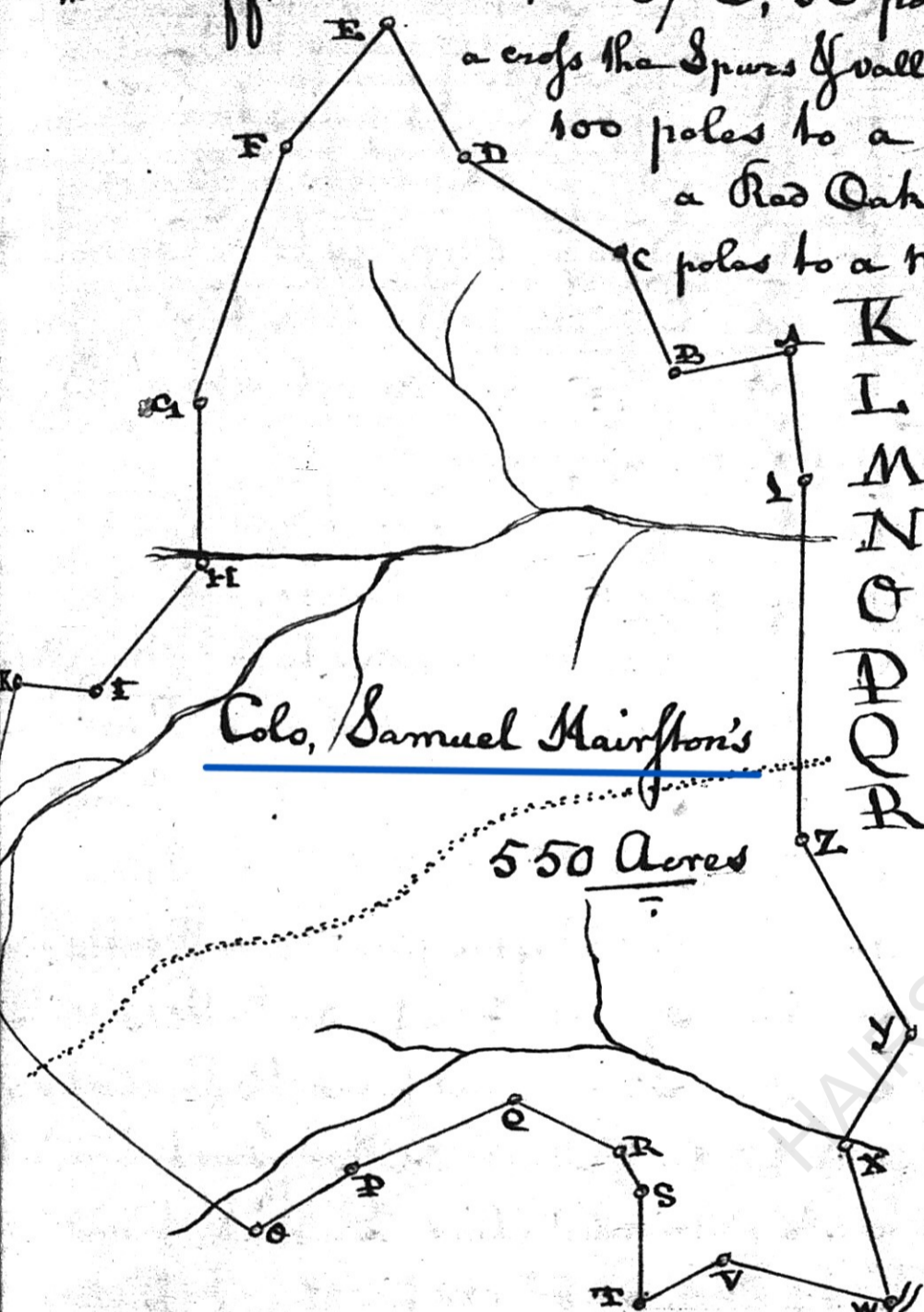


November 7, 1777,

Surveyed for Samuel Mairston 550 Acres of Land situate in Bedford County on the East side of Beaver Creek, and Bounded as followeth, viz, Beginning at his own Corner heap of Stones and Pointers, at A, thence along his Lines, from A to B, N 79 E, 40 poles to his Corner Shrub White Oak B to C, S 22 E, 50 poles to his Corner Pointers: C to D, S 55 E, 62 poles to his Corner Red Oak: D to E, S 26 E, 56 poles to his Corner Spanish Oak. thence off, E to F, N 37 E, 56 poles to a Black Jack, near Long Mountains; (thence



a cross the Spurs & valleys thereof to Pointers, at N) F to G, N 10 E, 100 poles to a Spanish Oak: G to H, N, 60 poles to a Red Oak just over a Branch: H to I, N 12 E, 60 poles to a white Oak: I to K, S 85 E, 36 po. to a Chesnut K to L, N 26 E, 60 po. to a Shrub white Oak L to M, N 65 E, 30 poles to a Black Jack M to N, N 40 E, 10 poles to Pointers N to O, N 52 W, 200 poles to a small white Oak O to P, S 57 W, 40 poles to a Pine P to Q, S 65 W, 60 poles to a Pine Q to R, N 62 W, 40 poles to a Pine R to S, N 25 W, 16 poles to a Pine S to T, N, 40 poles to a Pine T to V, S 60 W, 30 poles to a Pine V to W, N 74 W, 60 poles to his own Corner at the old Mill place, thence along his own Lines, W to X, S 15 E, 50 poles to his Corner Poplar at a Branch X to Y, S 20 W, 46 poles to his Corner Pointers: Y to Z, S 27 E, 80 poles to his Corner Pointers: Z to 1, S, 140 poles to his Corner Pointers: and 1 to A, S 5 E, 52 poles to the first Station

December, 20, 1777. Surveyed for William Marshall 40 Acres of Water, Rocks, &c situate on the South side of Bedford County, being Part of Staunton River; and Bounded as followeth, viz, Beginning at his own upper Corner, up the Bank; at A, thence from A to B, S 20 W, to the middle of the River B to C, down the middle of the same as it meanders 372 poles.



C to D, N 57 W, to the Point of land at the mouth of Whipping Creek: D, to A, up, by the River Bank as it meanders to the first Station
