John W. **Hairston died** Monday, November 9 at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Andrew Ritchie of Brownwood. Mr. **Hairston** had been in ill health for the past year. He made his home in Milam County, but had been in Brownwood since August, 1953.

Mr. **Hairston** was born April 5, 1882 in Coryell County, Texas. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Milton **Hairs-ton**. Mr. **Hairston** came to Milam County at the age of 18. He married Miss Elia Garner, December 1910. Mrs. Harrison preceded him in death on April 28, 1946.

Mr. **Hairston** served as Milam County Treasurer during the term of 1946 to 1948.
