This Indenture made and entered into this 26<sup>th</sup> day of June one thousand Eight hundred and forty six, between Samuel Harston of the County of Allen and State of Kentucky of the one part, and Jeremiah Whitney of said County and State of the other part witnesseth: That for and in consideration of sum of Two hundred dollars to me the said Harston in hand paid by the said Whitney, the receipt is hereby acknowledged, have bargained granted and sold, and by these presents do bargain grant sell and convey unto the said Jeremiah Whitney, a certain tract or parcel of Land lying on Big Barren River and in the County of Allen and State aforesaid, it being a part of Robert Fosters Military Survey and bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning on the River bluff on a hickory and Spanish oak near an old Fishdam, then running west to the first branch supposed to be fifty pole, the distance not known crossing with the branch then southwardly up the branch with its several meanders to the head spring to a sassaewood and dogwood, then southwardly, to a Mulberry and black gum on the top of a ridge, running still southwardly on to the first hollow containing an ash, Maple and dogwood, then running westwardly with the meanders turning to south with said hollow and branch to the left hand branch, containing in beech ironwood and Elm, then down the the left hand branch Eastwardly to its mouth or River, then Northwardly down the River with its several meanders to the beginning the quantity supposed to be one hundred Acres, but not known, this boundary of Land I the said Harston have bargained and sold, and by these presents, do warrant and forever defend the same from me my heirs Executors and administrators, or from the Claim or Claims of any person or persons whatever unto the said Whitney, his heirs, Executors, administrators or assigns.
