 of Elk River on both sides of Ferraris Creek in the third Section  
 of the ninth Range Beginning at the North East corner of said  
 Section a post oak marked A running from thence with the  
 Section line West three hundred and twenty poles to three small  
 Hickories and a post oak thence South two hundred and seventy  
 poles to a post oak and hickory marked IA in the North  
 West boundary line of 5000 acres Granted to John Rutledge thence  
 with that line North 15 degrees East thirty five poles to his  
 North corner ~~thence~~ three Black Oaks and a large hickory  
 thence with another of his lines South 45 East one hundred &  
<sup>eighteen</sup> poles to two hickories thence East crossing Ferraris Creek at 140  
<sup>in all 208 poles</sup> poles to a large Black Walnut and three post oaks in the  
 Eastern boundary line of the Section thence with that line crossing  
 Ferraris Creek at 80 poles in all three hundred and forty poles  
 to the beginning which tract is truly represented in the annexed  
 plat surveyed on the 27th day of September 1808;
