I Philip Koonce being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all my land and plantation that I am now in possession of during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between my four youngest children daughters that is to say Burdette, Saily Woods, Sophia Ann, Patsy Pina I also give to my wife my negro boy Sam and Charles and negro woman Malinda during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between my four youngest daughters as above stated I give and bequeath to Andrew McCartney and Amos Small fifty dollars each to be paid out of my stock and other perishable property all the balance of my worldly goods that I am seized with at this time to be sold for to pay my debts and the remainder whatever that may be I give to my wife during her natural life and at any time if she should think proper to do so, to give to the children any part of the above property that she may think just and so to do - I wish to be understood that I do not want any more property sold than a sufficiency to pay all my just debts whatever they may be I hereby appoint William McCee and my beloved wife sole Executors and Excutrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty three
