Know all men by these presents that Daniel Litterell of the County of Lee, in consideration of the sum of the natural love and affection and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars to me in hand paid, have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto John Litterell, Samuel Litterell, William Litterell, Daniel Litterell, Ewing Litterell, Charles Litterell, Susanna Litterell, Polly Litterell, Abigail Litterell, the following personal property, one horse of a brown color large in size, a brough eight years old, branded N on the near shoulder and D on the buttock; thirteen head of Cattle marked with a Swallow fork in the right ear and a smooth Crop in the left, seventy head of hogs of the same mark all my household furniture of all and every kind whatever, also my farming utensils and the said Daniel Litterell in consideration aforesaid covenant and agree, to warrant and defend the said property to the said persons, against the claim of all others whatsoever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th day of May 1801.
