Wherefore It is considered by the Court that Judgment ought not to be Rendered on the Verdict therein mentioned but that the same ought to be arrested and that the Plaintiffs pay to the Defendant his costs by him about his defence in that behalf expended. From which Judgment the Plaintiffs prayed an Appeal to the next Court of Appeals which is granted them who entered into and acknowledged Bond with security conditioned according to Law.
