Merry Lee Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia
To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting Know ye that
by Virtue and in consideration of a Land Office Treasury Warrant
Number fourteen thousand six hundred and fifteen issued the
fifth day of October one thousand seven hundred and eighty two,
There is granted by the said Commonwealth unto John Forbes
Esquire of Colin Robertson, a certain tract or parcel of Land
containing eight hundred and fifty Acres by Survey bearing date
the eighth day of April one thousand seven hundred and eighty
nine, lying and being in the County of Campbell on branches of
Popum, Rockcastle and Flat Creeks and bounded as followeth, to wit,
Beginning at Jacob Stemmons corner black jack on handless line
thence along handless line crossing branches of Popum Creek North
twelve poles to his corner spanish oak on the box of a hill of a Branch
of Popum Creek North twenty five degrees East ninety poles to his corner
pointers North fifty five degrees East one hundred and six teen poles
to his own and David Martins corner pine, thence along Martins line
North thirty seven degrees West two hundred and forty poles to his
corner spanish oak on the side of a high Hill, thence off North eighty
eight degrees West up thirty poles to a Chestnut oak upon the Summit
of Handless Mountain, thence along continuing upon the top
of the Mountain as it meanders one hundred and seventy poles
Southwestwardly to a Chestnut oak in a low part, thence North fifty
five degrees West down the mountain side ninety poles to pointers
on Zachariah Mooremans line at a drain, thence along his line
crossing the Branches of Rock Castle Creek, South twenty degrees
East fifty poles to his corner double Chestnut oak on the foot of
the Mountain, South forty degrees West one hundred and
sixty poles to his corner black jack South seventy five degrees
West down the foot of the said Mountain sixty six poles to
his corner red oak near a Branch and along his old line to Charles
Johnsons corner red oak, along his line South thirty
degrees East one hundred and forty poles to his corner

small chestnut, South twenty five degrees West one hundred poles to his corner black
 Jack in Russell's line, thence along Russell's line South sixty degrees East sixty
 eight poles to his corner double hickory on a Branch of flat Creek South
 thirty five degrees East eighty two poles to ^{double} Simmons corner, hickory thence
 along Simmons line North forty degrees East twenty poles crossing a drain
 to his corner small red oak, North twenty degrees East two hundred poles
 to his corner spanish oak and East crossing a branch of flat Creek one
 hundred and sixty poles to the beginning Including the upper end of
 C- and less Mountain with great part of the mountain. With its
 Appurtenances To Have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land, With
 its Appurtenances to the said John Forbes and his Heirs for ever. In Witness
 whereof the said Henry Lee Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of
 Virginia hath hereunto set his Hand and caused the lesser seal of the said
 Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the fifth day of April in
 the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety two, and of
 the Commonwealth the sixteenth.

 thousand five hundred Acre by survey bearing date the nineteenth day
 of June one thousand seven hundred and ninety, lying and being in
 the County of Nelson, and bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning at a
 black oak, mulberry and dogwood in the line of John Doss Survey of
 three thousand five hundred Acre and upper corner of James Dozers
 one thousand one Survey running thence with the line of the same North
 five hundred thirty four and a half poles crossing the middle fork of Pittman
 Creek at two hundred poles and several small drains to two white oaks
 also corner to the said Dozers Survey, thence East four hundred forty
 nine
