 in hand paid the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath
 Bargained sold Released and confirmed and by these presents doth
 Bargain sell Release and confirm unto the said Robert Harper & Thomas James
 and to their Heirs and Assigns forever one Certain Tract of Land
 containing two hundred and Seventy acres lying and being in the
 of Bedford on the Branches of Bever Creek and Bounded as followeth to wit
 Beginning at a Chestnut near a branch and Runing thence North
 Seven Degrees East Eighty Seven poles to a point whence North Twenty
 Degrees East Seventy Eight poles to a Red Oak whence North forty eight
 East Seventy one poles to a Hickory whence North Seventy Two Degrees East
 poles crossing the Creek to a White Oak whence North Ten Degrees West
 Hundred and fifty four poles to a Hickory whence South Eighty Four
 Seventy poles crossing the Creek to a pine whence South forty Two Degrees
 Two hundred and Twenty one poles to a White Oak whence south
 poles to a pine whence South fifty four Degrees East Sixty poles to a line
 and thence South ten Degrees East forty poles to the first station which
 is a swamp & Meadow and all other profits and commodities to the same
 and all the Estate Title Interest Claim and Demand whatsoever of him
 Thomas Morris of in and to the said Land and premises and every part
 To have and to hold the said Tract of Land and all other the before granted
 with their Appurtenances unto the said Robert Harper & Thomas James
 their Heirs and Assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof them

 in hand paid by the said Pleasant Moorman the Receipt whereof he doth hereby
 acknowledge hath given granted and by these presents do give grant Bargain sell
 Ensign and confirm unto the said Pleasant Moorman his Heirs &c one certain
 tract of land containing Two hundred Acres of Land lying on the Branches
 of Blackwater Creek Near Flemings Mountain and Bounded as followeth to wit
 Beginning at a Locust in Davis Corner thence along his lines South Fifty five
 degrees East Seventy Eight poles to a White Oak thence along Edmond Fare's line South
 ty four Degrees East Two hundred poles to a White Oak in the patent line thence
 long the said patent line South Twelve poles to a point whence South Eighty Degrees
 East supposed to be One hundred Seventy three Poles to a corner whence North fifty
 four Degrees West supposed to be one hundred and Sixty four poles to a Red Oak
 whence North Thirty five Degrees East supposed to be one hundred & Thirty Eight
