By permission of Almighty God I Jacob Coffman of Potomac  
County being of sound mind and disposing memory do constitute  
& ordain this my last Will & Testament in the first place I  
desire all my just debts and funeral Expenses paid by my Executors  
herein after named I give the fourth to my Sons Benjamin  
John & my daughter Fanny Adams One Thousand Acres of Land  
in all Mulerberg County Kentucky the same that Benjamin  
Coffman got of James Breckinridge to be divided among  
them as my Executors think just & equitable to wit, Two hundred  
Acres to John Two hundred Acres to my Daughter Fanny and  
Six hundred Acres to my Son Benjamin & their heirs forever  
And it is my will & desire that they pay out of the one Thou-  
sand Acres aforesaid One hundred pounds to my wife Barbara  
my Coffman to be proportionally paid by them Benjamin  
John & Fanny and if they refuse or delay payment my Exe-  
cutors are directed to sell so much of the aforesaid tract of one  
Thousand Acres as will pay her & apply the money accord-  
ingly I give my Son Jacob Coffman the plantation where  
he now lives according to the lines made lastly I constitute  
& appoint Christian Fish & <sup>James</sup> ~~James~~ Lawers Executors of this  
my last Will here by revoking all other wills by me heretofore  
made And do empower my Ex<sup>ors</sup> to Transfer to James



Breckinridge the plantation & Tenement where I now live containing about 250 Acres by Deed I also give my son Benjamin other One Thousand Acres more or less bought of James Breckinridge his choice of the Lands purchased of Col. James Breckinridge to him this his former my Will is that my son Jacob is to have his place by paying four hundred pounds to my heirs or the use hereafter mentioned (to wit) forty pounds per year to Mary Eliza my Daughter & Cate Landers In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of April 1807
