In the name of god Amain. I Thomas Jeffs of Botetourt  
County and Colony of Virginia being weak in body but of perfect  
Mind and Memory thanks be given unto god. Therefore Calling  
unto Mind the Mortality of My Body and knowing that it is  
Appoynted for all Men once to Die, Mark and Observe this My Last  
Will and Testament that is to say Unfeignably, and first of all I give  
and Recommend My Soul unto the hands of Almighty God, that gives  
and My Body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian  
Burial at the Discretion of My Wife a Nothing Doubting but at the  
General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power  
of god, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased  
god to bless Me within this Life I give Devise and Dispose of the  
same in the following Manner and form I give and Bequeath to my  
Dearly Beloved Wife Mary whilst she remains my Widow the Planta-  
tion wherupon I now Live: With five Work Hands Also six Breeding  
Mares to be taken out of my hole Stock for the use of the plantation  
Also Ten Milch Cows also ten Head of Sheep Also the five Negroes  
Sampson Mercy Dave Peg. Frank Also the Mill and Vessels and  
farming Utensels With all the Household furniture now in my possession  
With all My Stock of Hogs which Articles above mentioned to goe  
With the Plantation I Vest in my Wife Mary for the Support of her and  
My family which I Leave at my Death During her Widowhood and in  
Case of her Marring the above named Negroes and Stock to Sell to  
My Son Solomon and to his heirs for ever With the Plantation With the  
Increase of Negroes and Stock except what will be expended for the  
Support of my family and it is my Desire that my Wife will take  
care of my Sons Education and give him proper and sufficient
