The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the Coronor Henry  
Syne hath in <sup>his</sup> hands of the Estate of John King. One negro Boy named Reuben  
As is mentioned in an Order of Sale in favour of the above bound George Hairston  
of Sixty four Pounds & Nineteen shillings & 10<sup>rs</sup>. Now if the above bound. George  
Hairston shall well and truly indemnify the Coronor aforesaid his Heirs &c. from  
all Costs and Damages that may or shall in any wise accrue on account of the said  
Coronor selling the above mentioned Reuben the property of John King to satisfy  
the aforesaid George Hairstons order of Sale, then the above obligation to be  
void otherwise Remain in force

 Hairstons Line thence Round the said Lines Including all the Land which Phillip  
 Ryan Sr. purchased of Robert Stockton - Together with all houses fences Orchards  
 and every of its appurtenances of every kind whatsoever, to the only use and behoof of him  
 the said Phillip Ryan jr his heirs and assigns for ever. and further the said Phillip Ryan  
 Sr. doth command and agree to and with the said Phillip Ryan jr his heirs and assigns  
 To have and to hold the aforesaid Land and Premises with every of its appurtenances what  
 soever unto the said Phillip Ryan jr his heirs and assigns for ever. and the said Phillip Ryan  
 Sr. doth warrant and for ever defend the said Land & Premises from the claim or claims of  
 every other person or persons whatsoever, In Witness whereof the said Phillip Ryan Sr.
