in the State aforesaid planter in consideration of Ten  
pounds Sterling to me paid by James Hendrix of the  
same County and state aforesaid planter have granted  
bargained sold and released and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said  
James Hendrix all that plantation or tract of land  
Containing twenty two acres being part of a tract  
Originally granted to John Sibley Sen<sup>r</sup>. situate lying  
and being in Fairfield County and state aforesaid  
on the waters of Mullark the waters of little River  
bounded to the S<sup>E</sup> East on John Shaffers land & East on  
Said Hendrix land and westwardly on John Andrews  
land Together with all and singular the rights members  
hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining  
to have and to hold all and singular the premises  
beforementioned unto the said James Hendrix his  
heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself  
my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant and  
forever defend all and singular the said premises unto  
the said James Hendrix his heirs and assigns against  
myself and my heirs and against every person whom  
soever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any  
part thereof.
